How to contact the health services

For non-life threatening accidents and illnesses:

Call your local Medical Centre

If you are not well, the starting point is **your local Medical Centre**. If you need urgent care advice and your local Medical Centre is closed, your call will be transferred to your Regional Medical Centre (open 08.00 – 20.00 every day). When the Regional Medical Centre is closed, your call will divert to a telephone advice service provided 24 hours a day, 365 days a year by qualified clinical staff who will assess your case and decide the best course of action to take.

In a medical emergency:

Call 112

If you believe that life is in danger or an accident or illness is serious enough to require accident and emergency treatment, then **you must** at all times call the local ambulance service using the emergency telephone number of **112**.

Once the ambulance services have been called, **you should call your local Medical Centre** who will liaise with your Unit and Welfare Services where appropriate.

If you are in Hospital:

Call 0800 588 99 36

If you attend A&E or are admitted to a German hospital you should **call the Hospital Hotline**. It is manned 24 hours a day, 365 days a year by a Hospital Liaison Officer (HLO). The Hospital Hotline is free for calls made from a landline. Calls made from a mobile phone may be charged.

HLOs are fluent in German and English and can assist you with language problems. They are also familiar with procedures and practices within German hospitals and can help make your stay as comfortable as possible.

Acting on your behalf, and with your consent, the HLO's will also facilitate liaison between the hospital, the Medical Centre, the Unit and the welfare agencies (if applicable) to ensure administrative tasks are carried out promptly.
